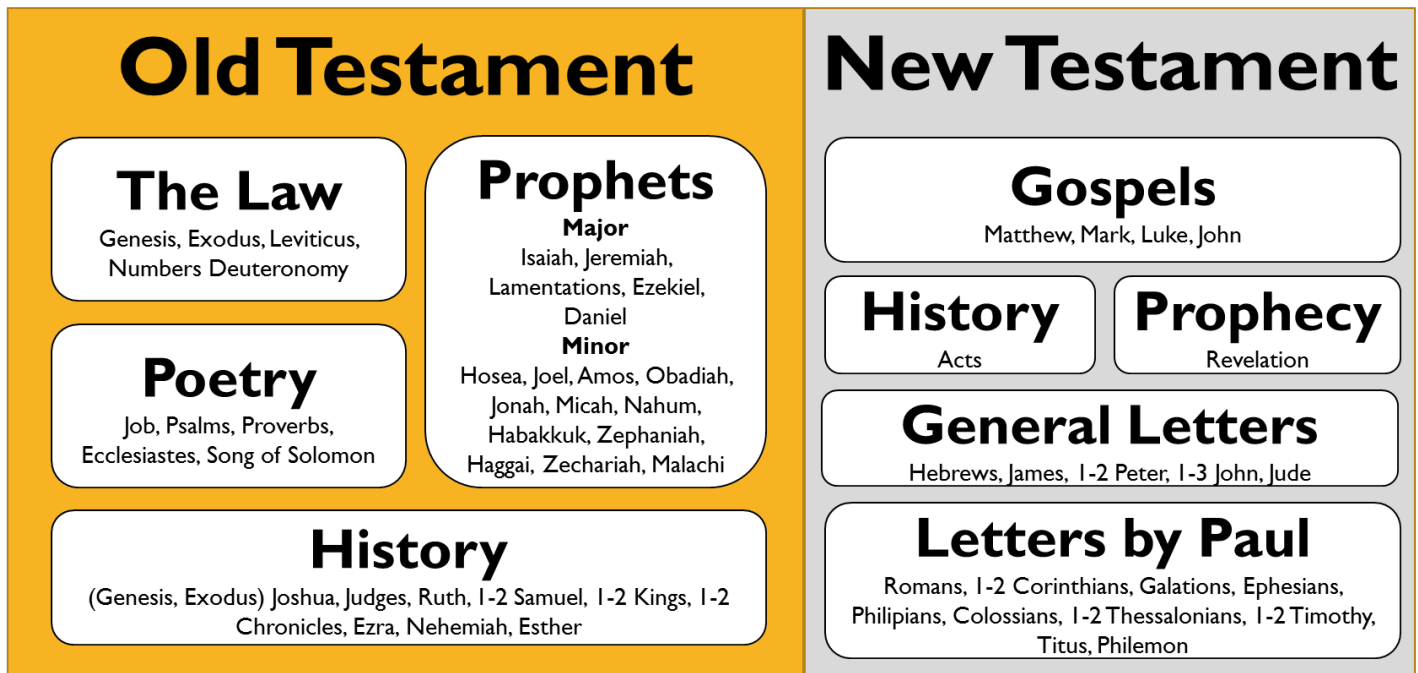
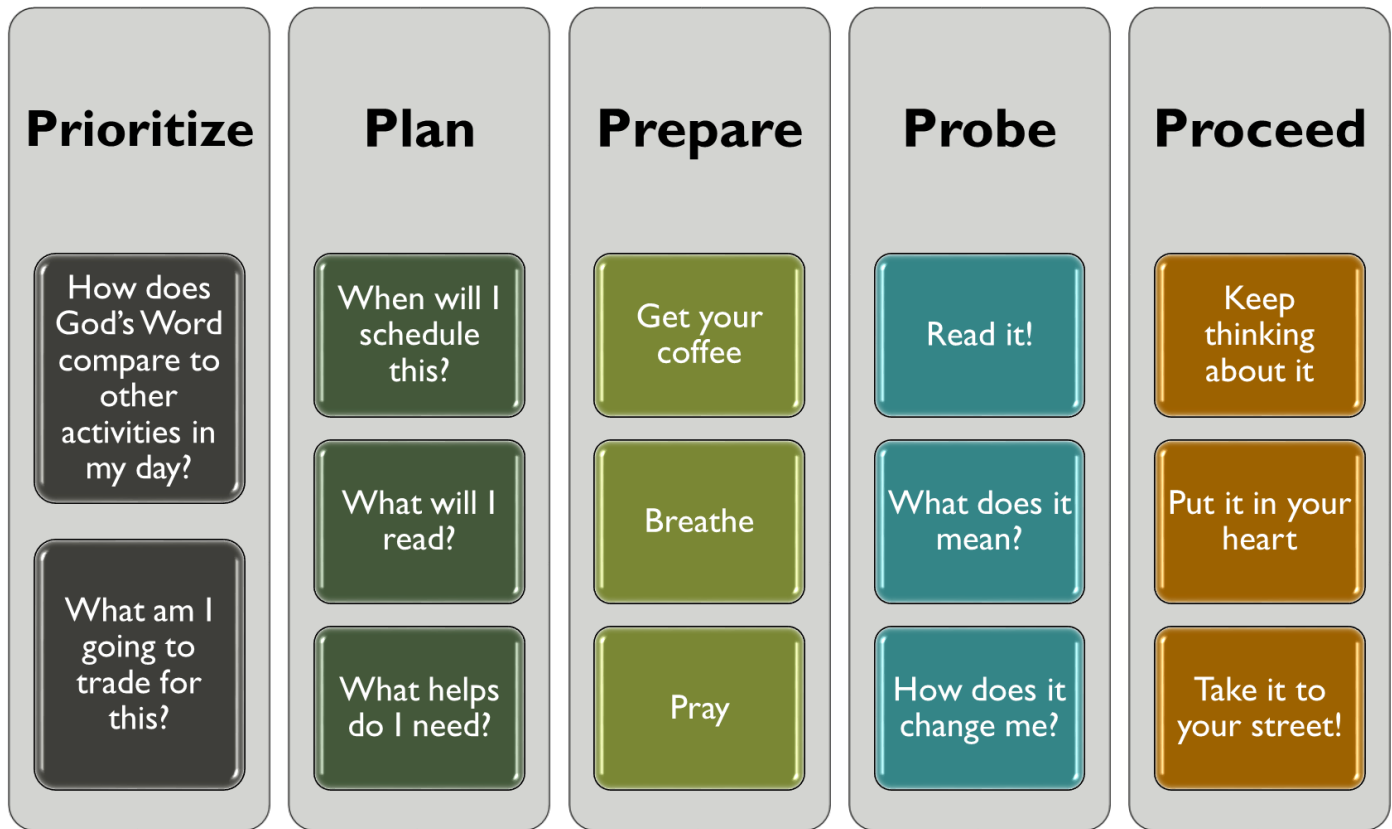

www.biblehub.com – website with multiple translations of the Bible, search capabilities, Strong’s Concordance with definitions of the words in the original languages of Hebrew & Greek

Bible app from Life.Church for your smart phone. Multiple translations of the Bible, search tool, reading plans, devotionals, audio Bible, social connections to help with sharing and accountability. Ability to highlight and take notes.

“Vine’s Concise Dictionary of Bible Words” – dictionary for helping explain words and concepts used in the Bible that might not be used in your everyday vocabulary, or in a different usage.
